# Invitation to Participate

Thank you for your interest in participating in Neha's written dialogue!

On March 7th, 2024, we, Sylvia Maracle, Marie Pascaline Menono, and Pamela Glode-Desrochers, were named as members of the review panel, known as Neha, that will examine the right to safe, adequate and affordable housing of women, Two Spirit, Trans, and gender-diverse people, and the government's duty to uphold this right.

Neha means "our ways" in Kanien'kehà:ka-Mohawk. It describes a way of life that is open, peaceful, supportive and healing. As such, Neha will be a space where all people can share their stories and work together towards solutions. We will offer an inclusive dialogue for you and everyone to participate and share about adequate housing, a fundamental human right in Canada for all. The human right to adequate housing asserts that all people have the equal right to live in dignity in a safe, adequate, affordable, and secure home, and that each person is entitled to have access to housing that satisfies their needs. Many women, Two Spirit, Trans, and gender-diverse people face barriers to their human right to adequate housing on the basis of gender, gender identity, Indigenous identity, race, disability, age, sexual orientation, immigration status, socioeconomic status, income, geography, family status, and other intersecting factors.

Neha is an ever-expanding circle (see the circle design on the right), where there is room for everyone to honour their unique stories guided by four foundational elements:

- Vision refers to the way forward to ensure that no one is left behind when it comes to accessing safe, adequate, affordable housing that meets their needs.
- Knowledge refers to the wisdom and information that is needed to inform or support this vision.
- Reason refers to the rationale for pursuing this vision, especially to uphold Canada's commitments to national and international housing and human rights.
- Action refers to the actions necessary to make this vision a reality.

Thank you for participating in the written dialogue and we look forward to hearing from you.
